From the President's Desk

Rain, rain go away...come back some other day! I'm sure you are feeling the same as me, we have had enough rain. It certainly has diminished our ability to play pickleball. Which just makes us appreciate the indoor opportunities that we do have, such as the YMCA, the North Laurel Community Center, the Meadowbrook Athletic Center and Glenwood Community Center. During the grand opening of the CA Owen Brown pickleball courts, I spoke to someone from CA who said she was working on setting up lines in the Supreme Sports Club Arena. Our association plans to meet with CA to promote more pickleball venues and we will be pushing for those lines in the arena as well. It is tough competing with basketball, considering the number of programs and how well established they are in using almost all the indoor facilities available. However, HCPA will continue to search for new indoor venues as best as we can. The association is working with Howard County Community College to once again use their gymnasium for winter. Like last year, we will likely establish a time on Sunday's starting in January and going till March. We will also explore the use of the smaller school gyms to see if any won't be used for basketball. Although small they do offer indoor capabilities. Finally, there are the CA racquetball courts at Supreme Sports Club. CA has nets and members can reserve the courts. These work very well for drills as well as games, provided you are flexible with the rules. I often go there for drills and end with a game that allows each player to call a hindrance on the serve if the ball is too close to the walls. So, there are options, although limited. But if that dang on rain would just stop, we can get back to playing outside again.

I would like to thank Rob Schimdt, our Vice President, for taking on the job of Organized Play. He is doing great at coordinating the use of the PB equipment along with the setup and takedown of the nets. Please consider volunteering to help with the organized play sessions. We need members to volunteer to take one or more sessions to decide if playing if possible, bring the nets to the site, clear off the courts of debris and put up and take down the nets. It works so much better if we have several people we can work with to take this responsibility.

I have started doing intermediate lessons using the Pickleball Trainer machine at the Locust Park courts on Saturday. I am not sure how often I will do these lessons but if the weather holds I may try to do more in November.

The Board has been advocating with the Columbia Association for more Winter play opportunities and getting one of our Saturday play courts converted to permanent pickleball courts. We may have an opportunity to try using the arena at the Supreme Sports Club for play this winter. Stay tuned. Our efforts to get CA to convert either Locust Park or the Ice Rink courts converted to pickleball courts is still

an ongoing effort. I think one of these two will be converted at some point but I don't know exactly when.

The Board will also be discussing with Howard County Recreation and Parks how they can expand the pickleball playing opportunities at their facilities. We will discuss their plans for dual use courts at the fields behind the East Columbia Library that they will be building next summer. The 6 courts will be lined for both youth tennis (quick start) and pickleball. We will also discuss having pickleball lines on more tennis courts and long-range goals for pickleball at Blandair Park.
